Statement from CMS Nursing Home Visitation- COVID-19

- On April 10, 2023, the President signed legislation that ended the COVID-19 national emergency. On May 11, 2023, the COVID-19 public health emergency is expected to expire.
 While the PHE will end, CMS still expects facilities to adhere to infection prevention and control recommendations in accordance with accepted national standards.

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Core Principals of COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control

- Provide guidance to visitors who have a positive viral test for COVID-19 and/or had close contact with someone with COVID-19.
- Hand hygiene Alcohol-based hand rub is preferred
- Face covering or mask CDC guidance
- Post visual alerts at the entrance and other places. Alerts should include instructions about current IPC recommendations (when to use source control



Core Principals of COVID-19 IPC continued

- Cleaning practices should include frequently touched surfaces and designated visitation areas after each visitation.
- Appropriate staff use of PPE
- Effective cohorting of residents
- Resident and staff testing conducted following nationally accepted standards



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Visitation

- Non- restricted indoor and outdoor
- Person-centered
- Privacy
- Visitors should adhere to core principals of infection prevention



Visitation During Outbreak Investigation

- Single new case of COVID-19 among residents or staff
- Occur in the resident room
- Well-fitting masks
- Limit movement of visitors in the facility during investigation



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Reminders

- CMS encourages but does not mandate offering testing to visitors
- CMS encourages all visitors to stay up to date with their COVID-19 vaccinations
