- Identify, investigate, and resolve complaints
- Educate consumers about long-term care services.
- Provide information to the public about residents' rights
- Provide technical support for the development of resident and family councils.

- Advocate for changes to improve residents' quality of life and care.
- Represent resident interests before governmental agencies.
- Seek legal, administrative, and other remedies to protect residents.
- Ensure residents have regular and timely access to the Ombudsman.

Who Do LTC Ombudsmen Serve?



Individuals, regardless of age, who live in long-term care facilities

As resident advocates:

- The resident guides Ombudsman action.
- Ombudsmen need a resident's consent prior to taking any action on a complaint or sharing resident information.
- The Ombudsman seeks to resolve complaints to the residents' satisfaction.
- The Ombudsman represents residents' interests, both individually and systemically.
- The Ombudsmen empowers residents and promotes selfadvocacy.

An Ombudsman responds to a resident's EXPRESSED interest; not necessarily their BEST interest.

Ombudsman Programs are Unique



- State Ombudsman/Deputy Director are state employees under the direction of the SUA
 - Programmatic oversight vs. personnel oversight of local ombudsmen
- Not licensing or regulatory investigators
- Not APS investigators
- No direct care for residents
- No mandatory reporting of abuse/neglect

Residents' Rights




All long-term care residents have rights...

- to make independent choices



Indiana's LTCOP Volunteer Program




Indiana's LTCOP is implementing a new statewide Volunteer program that will enable us to:
