Salmonella Outbreak – FYI



- Diced Onion products distributed in Long Term Care Settings
- CDC and FDA issued a food safety alert regarding a Salmonella outbreak linked to fresh diced onions.
- These products have been distributed to long term care facilities
- IHCA/INCAL sent a blast out to members late last week

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Reminder – Up-To-Date



- The approval of the New COVID-19 vaccines for 2023-2024 triggered a change in the NHSN surveillance definition of "up-todate" on COVID-19 vaccine to align with the new vaccine recommendations.
- As of September 25, 2023 individuals are considered "up-to-date" with their COVID-19 vaccinations if they meet one of the following criteria:
- 1. Received a 2023-2024 updated COVID-19 vaccine OR
- 2. Received a bivalent COVID-19 vaccine within the last two months

COVID-19 VIS



- COVID-19 Vaccine Information Statement | CDC
- Updated (2023-2024 Formula) COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older
- Everyone 12 years and older should get 1 dose of an FDAapproved, updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine. If you received a COVID-19 vaccine recently – wait at least 8 weeks after your most recent dose to get the updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine.

Vaccine continued



- COVID-19 vaccine may be given at the same time as other vaccines
- Allergic reactions seek medical attention
- Adverse reactions should be reported to the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS).
 - Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS) (hhs.gov)

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Mitigate Risk



- COVID-19 outbreaks are occurring
 - Have you informed your staff and residents of the vaccines that they are eligible to receive?
 - Do you know who wants and does not want an updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine?
 - · Is the resident's desire documented?
 - Are you able to locate the vaccine?
 - Have you documented your actions and communicated with appropriate residents about delays or given a date in which the desired vaccine will be administered?

CHIRP Reporting Question

- Is there a requirement mandating CHIRP reporting by nursing homes or assisted living of the administration of the COVID-19 vaccinations that are given by the facility?
- Response IDOH
- If a vaccine is through a pharmacy and administered on the pharmacy's behalf – then Indiana Code would require it being reported to CHIRP regardless of age.
- If the facility provider is giving the vaccine as you do other medications and injections – on behalf of the facility and resident relationship – No, there is not a requirement to report to CHIRP as long as the individual is over 19

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So.....



- If your facility has depended on accessing CHIRP for up-to-date vaccine information and not all over 19 vaccines are required to be reported into CHIRP The data base is not a reliable source going forward.
- The ability of the individual to provide vaccine information is now your source.

RSV Vaccine – older adults PINCAL



CDC Recommendations

RSV Vaccine:

· CDC recommends a single dose of RSV for ages 60 and older based on shared clinical decision making.

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Influenza Vaccine – older adult

- · CDC Recommends that adults aged 65 and older receive any one of the higher dose or adjuvanted influenza vaccine
- If higher dose or adjuvanted is not available, they may receive any other age-appropriate influenza vaccine.
